selection criteria (by scholarship type)

Note that all selection criteria must be met in order for an applicant to be considered for any form of scholarship offered by Campus Living Villages.

Definitions:

UAI = Universities Admission Index.

Applies only to students completing secondary school in Australia.

GPA = Grade Point Average.

This is usually listed on exam results or university academic transcripts.

Required criteria to be included with completed application form

Academic Scholarships

Short (no more than 500 words) essay on why you have undertaken your specific course of study and why you believe they are a suitable candidate for the scholarship.

In addition, applicants must meet and include proof of the following information as applicable:

For first year students (in 2009):

Australia

1. UAI (or equivalent) of 90.00 or greater, AND
2. Academic transcripts for final year Secondary School results

New Zealand

1. Minimum 42 credits at Level 3 or higher on the National Qualifications Framework
2. Academic transcripts for final year Secondary School results

For existing undergraduate students (not including postgraduate):

Australia

1. GPA of 3.0 (B average) or greater, AND
2. Academic transcripts of all completed university subjects to date of application

New Zealand

1. GPA 4.0 (B- average) or better, AND
2. Academic transcripts of all completed university subjects to date of application

For postgraduate students (including those commencing postgraduate study in 2009):

1. GPA of 3.5 (or B+ average in NZ) or greater, OR
 2. Prior achievement of First Class Honours degree or equivalent, AND
 3. Academic transcripts of all completed university subjects to date of completion

Sports Scholarships

Proof of representing the University (or appropriate University Sports Organisation) in a sporting team or individual event. Such representation must be ongoing and not of a "one off" nature. Such evidence should take the form of a letter from the University.

In addition, applicants must meet and include proof of the following information as applicable:

For first year students (in 2009):

Australia

1. UAI (or equivalent) of 75.00 or greater, with accompanying transcripts

New Zealand

1. Minimum 42 credits at Level 3 or higher on the National Qualifications Framework

For existing undergraduate students (postgraduate students are ineligible):

Australia

1. GPA of 2.5 (or C+ average) or better, with accompanying transcripts

New Zealand

1. GPA of 3.0 (C+ average) or better, with accompanying transcripts

Note that recipients of Sports Scholarships are also required to assist in the organisation of and participate in Village sports events throughout the year, except where such participation clashes with representative duties. Recipients are also expected to compete at the annual University Games. Failure to meet this requirement may result in the cancellation of the scholarship.

Equity Scholarships

Proof of financial hardship in the form of a Centrelink Income Statement (Australia) or statement from Studylink (New Zealand).

In addition, applicants must meet and provide proof of the following information:

For first year students (in 2009):

Australia

1. UAI (or equivalent) of 90.00 or greater, with accompanying transcripts

New Zealand

1. Minimum 42 credits at Level 3 or higher on the National Qualifications Framework

For existing undergraduate students (not including postgraduate):

Australia

1. GPA of 3.2 (B+ average) or better, with accompanying transcripts

New Zealand

1. GPA of 6.0 (B+ average) or better, with accompanying transcripts

Indigenous Scholarships

Written proof of ancestry of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent (for Australian applicants), or Maori decent (for New Zealand applicants).

For first year students (in 2009):

Australia

1. UAI (or equivalent) of 90.00 or better, with accompanying transcripts

New Zealand

1. Minimum 42 credits at Level 3 or higher on the National Qualifications Framework

For existing undergraduate students (not including postgraduate):

Australia

1. GPA of 3.0 (B average) or better, with accompanying transcripts

New Zealand

1. GPA of 5.0 (B average) or better, with accompanying transcripts

CLV Scholarships

The CLV Scholarship is considered the most prestigious of the scholarships offered by Campus Living Villages. It is available only to existing undergraduate or postgraduate students and may be awarded on the basis of academic achievement, sporting achievement, contribution to the arts, or community service. Basic eligibility criteria are:

1. GPA of 3.2 (B+ average) or better, OR
2. Prior achievement of First Class Honours, AND
3. Academic transcripts of all completed university subjects to date of application

Applicants must also submit an essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words outlining:

1. The basis on which they have applied, AND
2. Their achievements to date in this area, AND
3. The impact that the prize money would have on their future work.

other eligibility criteria + conditions of entry

- The following guidelines apply to all scholarships offered by Campus Living Villages.
- All recipients of scholarships will be determined by CLV based upon the criteria outlined above. However, not all candidates meeting these criteria will necessarily be awarded scholarships.
- CLV reserves the right to not award scholarships in a year if no candidates are considered suitable by the scholarship selection panel.
- Scholarships are paid as rental subsidies with the exception of the CLV Scholarship which is paid as a one-off cash prize. Rental subsidies take the form of a weekly or fortnightly deduction (depending on whether rent is paid on a weekly or fortnightly basis)
- Scholarship amounts are paid in the currency of the country in which they are awarded (ie: Australian or New Zealand dollars)
- Scholarship recipients must be enrolled as full-time students and must reside at a CLV village for the year the scholarship has been awarded. Part-time and distance learning applicants are not eligible.
- Applicants must hold current Citizenship or Residency for the country in which the CLV Village that the applicant resides in is located, or a valid Student Visa. CLV retains the right to be the final arbiter of an applicant's eligibility.
- If a scholarship recipient leaves the Village, withdraws from their course of study, leaves university altogether or otherwise breaches the specific criteria of eligibility as listed above, their scholarship will be terminated with immediate effect and all rental payments ceased.
- Scholarships may be terminated if CLV deems the following:
 - Unsatisfactory academic performance (such as falling below the required academic standards pertaining to their scholarship)
 - Unsatisfactory performance or involvement in scholarship-related activities (eg: Sport)
 - The recipient acts in a way so as to bring CLV, the Village or the University into disrepute.
- For academic scholarships, the recipient must not have previously completed a similar academic qualification of equal or higher level. For example, a recipient completing a Bachelor of Science must not hold a Bachelors or higher degree in any Science course.
- All recipients must advise CLV if they are receiving any other type of scholarship, including the type and awarding source. CLV reserves the right to terminate scholarships if the recipient does not disclose this information.
- CLV accepts no responsibility for any tax implications that may arise from the grant of a scholarship to a scholarship recipient. Applicants should seek independent financial advice prior to lodging their applicant for a scholarship.
